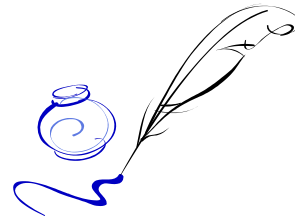
A Message from our President

Reviewing Search Engines for Genealogy Research

[AllTheWeb](http://www.alltheweb.com/), [http://www.alltheweb.com/] this search engine lets you specify the type of search (I did actually find an interesting article from a Kentucky genealogy society newsletter on my ancestor. I used the regular search with the name and surname. It is the only site so far that has found it.)
[AltaVista](http://www.altavista.com/) [http://www.altavista.com/], a web index. An [AltaVista:UK](#) site is available, and also a simplified graphic-free [text search form](#) interface. This is always a terrific search engine. I like to use the advanced search option.

[ANZWEERS Search Centre](http://www.anzwers.com.au/), [http://www.anzwers.com.au/] a guide to Australian and New Zealand Internet resources. Be sure the box is checked for Australia or New Zealand, and then add your criteria.

[European search engines, directories and lists](http://www.netmasters.co.uk/european_search_engines/), [http://www.netmasters.co.uk/european_search_engines/] listed by country. This lists many sites for each nation. I didn't try them all, so if you find a favorite, let us know.

[Ixquick](#), a metasearch engine that queries twelve other search engines (On this one, I found a DNA chart with my ancestor on it.) I put quote marks around the name and surname ex: "claibourn cox" to get results limited to this name in this exact form).

[SearchUK](#), a search engine with a focus on UK domains (This pulled up some interesting private family tree sites. I again surrounded the exact name in quote marks and added a place name.)

And, of course, there is always Google Advanced Search...my personal favorite. Also try Google books [http://books.google.com/]. Some books are entirely digitized. Try place names.

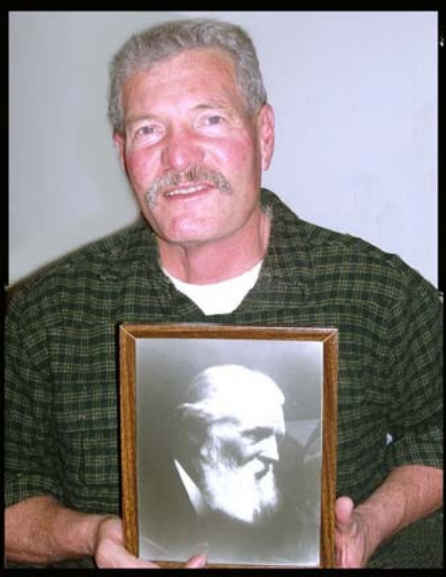

So You Thought Researching Patronyms Was Hard

County Clerk John Tuteur reports that, effective Jan. 1, 2009, California law permits either party to a marriage to change their middle or last name when applying for a marriage license. Neither party can change their first name. Either party to the marriage may adopt any of the following middle or last names: the current last name of either party, the last name of either party given at birth, a name combining into a single last name all or a segment of the current last names or the birth last names or a hyphenated combination of last names. A brochure describing the new law is available at www.cdph.ca.gov/certlic/birthdeathmar/Documents; click on Name Equality Act.

Michael Hanna Muir holds a portrait of his great grandfather, John Muir (1838 – 1914), the famous naturalist. Muir was the father of the environmentalist movement who successfully advocated preservation of the Yosemite Valley and many other wilderness areas. He was the founder of the Sierra Club and a noted author.

Michael, whose grandmother, Louisa, was the daughter of John Muir, carries on the family traditions in a unique way. He is the Director of Access Adventure (www.accessadventures.org) an organization which provides wheelchair accessible horse-drawn carriage rides for persons of all ages into wilderness areas where participants have access to beautiful vistas. A champion driver, in 2003 Muir led an international team of horsemen with disabilities driving wheelchair accessible carriages from San Diego, CA following the pioneer Southern Overland Trail to Washington, D.C.



This trek was the reverse of that of another ancestor, great-great grandfather Dr. John Strentzel, later the father-in-law of John Muir, who during the gold rush era in 1849 made the wagon train journey with his wife and two children from Honey Grove, Texas to San Diego. Michael read for his audience Strentzel's fascinating account of the many hardships the family endured, from near death by drought or drowning to Indian encounters, before settling first on the Tuolumne River and some years later at Martinez. There Strentzel established a prosperous ranch and fruit orchard where his two daughters grew up. John Muir, husband of Louisa Strentzel, managed the farm for his father-in-law for a number of years.

In the audience were Michael Muir's cousin, Bill Hanna, and Michael's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ross Hanna. Mr. Hanna's mother was John Muir's daughter, Wanda, who married a Hanna. Michael chose to change his name from Muir Hanna to Hanna Muir because of his professional activities associated with the Muir name.

The audience was very appreciative of Michael's presentation and had many questions. The group would like to have Michael return and show the film of his carriage travels across the country.

BOOK REVIEW

The Genealogist's Address Book gives you access to all the key sources of genealogical information, providing names, addresses, phone numbers, fax numbers, e-mail addresses, websites, names of contact persons, and other pertinent information for more than 27,000 organizations, including libraries, archives, societies, government agencies, vital records offices, professional bodies, publications, research centers, and special interest groups. We have it here at the library, in the Sources section, 929.3 D24b

CALIFORNIA NEWSPAPERS

I had an opportunity to visit the exhibits at the California Library Association Conference, which was held at the San Jose Convention Center this past November. One of the tables was manned by librarians from UC Riverside, who are associated with the California Newspaper Project (CNP). The CNP online catalog is a comprehensive source of information about California Newspapers. It details newspaper titles and holdings for more than 1,400 libraries, museums, historical societies and publishers' offices throughout California. The catalog contains records for more than 14,400 United States newspaper titles held in California repositories; about 9,000 of these newspapers were or are published in California. You can find and search the catalog at <http://cmp.ucr.edu/cnpsearchdb.html>. Although I was aware of this project, which has been around for many years, what I learned was that UC Riverside is now also the host of the California Digital Newspaper Collection.

With funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities and LSTA grants from the California State Library, over 150,000 pages of California newspapers spanning the years 1849-1911 have been digitized. They include the Alta California (1849-1889); the San Francisco Call (1900-1910); the Amador Ledger (1900-1911); the Imperial Valley Press (1901-1911), and the Los Angeles Herald (1905-1907). 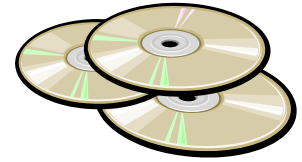
