The final result of his four-year journey was his book *A Noble Heritage*, which is now part of our library collection.

Mary's Book Corner



I just finished reading Steven Roberts' memoir called *My Fathers' Houses*. It's not a typical genealogy book in that he does not go researching in public documents, but he does travel to Poland and Israel to flesh out his grandfather's stories. He knew his immigrant grandparents and grew up hearing their stories. As a professional journalist of some standing, he is able to tell his family story in rich, textured layers. He is able to tie his story together with the places and times in which his family lived. He has a great deal of insight about how they influenced his own life and career. As a personal note, I really enjoyed reading about his father's rather short-lived venture into publishing children's books. During the 1940s, he specialized in creating children's books that were also toys in an attempt to fill in the gap from rationed metals. Unfortunately, today they are so rare that I can't afford to add any of them to my collection.

Did You Miss Our June Program? If so, here is a review.

Dr. Jeffrey Paull's presentation at the Program Meeting on June 20, 2013, left his audience eager to learn more of his fascinating family history. He diligently researched his ancestors for four years, knowing only his parents' and grandparents' names. Dr. Paull was able to trace his family's lineage back to the medieval French biblical commentator *Rashi* (1040-1105).

One of the things that his audience learned was that until the late 1880s, Jewish families had no surnames. It was not until they came under the rule of the Russian Empire that they were assigned surnames, generally in reference to the communities in which they lived.

Dr. Paull has inspired us to move forward with our desire to publish our family histories. His book *A Noble Heritage* is a wonderful addition to our library.
