This may be about a subject that is only of interest to me (not that that has stopped me before). I use an iPad almost exclusively anymore. I am not endorsing an Apple product as I am very impressed by the Google Chrome-book also. But I do want to tell you about amazing applications that I use for genealogy. I compose my NL article, add photos & email to our esteemed editor from my iPad in front of the TV or in from my patio chaise. Decadent, I know!

Now to the apps which are available for a multitude of formats not just iPad.

RootsMagic app which transfers my entered data file from desktop to iPad. I cannot change nor add to the info on my iPad but that will surely change in the future. I do access all of my trees. Great for my trips to the library. Researching at a library, I just take a photo of the front page for my source and the page that has the info. When at my laptop, I can add it to my RootsMagic with the source or print it out. No note taking or copy machine involved.

Ancestry app displays trees, any hints and connects to DNA info. It is at my fingertips. But I can also see it on the website if I wish but this is very quick and simple.

Additionally, there are many apps for reading books, iBooks, Google Play Books, Kindle, etc. by using an app like LIBBY or OverDrive which connects to a library. Choose a library and enter your card #. I can check out any of their over several thousand digitized books, many are audiobooks.

My library is part of the Northern California Digital Collection. Most any library, anywhere will give you a library card, most are free. I have only been rejected once...residents only!

Additionally, one of my favorites, Internet Archive, also has an app. Choose the search button on the upper right and type genealogy after the colon and see what's there. Also typing in any subject or place is useful. It has more nonfiction volumes digitized than most other libraries sites.

Last of all, if you do not use apps, still look at the Internet Archive site on your computer at <https://archive.org> as it is the most exciting genealogy research site ever!!

Finding Family


I hope you are enjoying the Napa Valley Register articles entitled "Finding Family," which runs the first Monday of every month.
